

Teen First Responder Camp

August 4-8, 2025

The Emergency Medicine Institute is offering a structured five-day program for motivated teenagers ages 13-17, interested in exploring health and public safety careers.

Topics covered will include:

- Personal health and wellness
- Career professionalism
- Skills review for working in health and public safety

Camp participants will have the opportunity to interact with all levels of health and public safety professionals including fire, police, EMS, K9s, wilderness medicine, physicians, nurses and more! Camp participants will also participate in a fieldtrip to Dorney Park in Allentown, PA. Lunch will be provided during this fieldtrip.

All participants will be certified in American Heart Association CPR/First Aid and Stop the Bleed, along with learning life and business skills throughout the week. Teens will also have the opportunity to deliver a 5-minute oral presentation to their camp peers on any health/public safety topic.

- August 4, 6, & 8 will be located at 2100 Mack Blvd., Allentown
- August 5 will be at Lehigh Valley Hospital-Cedar Crest for a hospital tour
- August 7 will be at Dorney Park located at 4000 Dorney Park Rd, Allentown
